




Experience the lifestyle of pioneer homesteaders at the Ingalls Homestead. Twist hay, grind wheat, make rope and drive a horse drawn covered wagon across the native grass prairie to a live one-room country school. Imagine living on Laura's wide-open prairie.

"It was fun to explore the farm and surprising how much variety and how many things of interest could be found on 160 acres that at a careless glance looked like all the rest of the prairie." - Laura Ingalls Wilder, Pioneer Girl: The Annotated Autobiography

Lured by the prospect of free land from the Homestead Act of 1862, the Ingalls family traveled over a thousand miles in a covered wagon to homestead. They completed the requirements - live on the land for five years, build a home, and cultivate at least ten acres of land - here in Dakota Territory. Laura's books share the stories of hard work and sacrifices her family endured to gain title to this piece of Dakota prairie.

Today this land is a place for visitors to experience Laura's stories. Native prairie grasses cover over a hundred acres and period buildings house exhibits. Hands-on activities allow visitors to understand our agricultural heritage. Visitors can camp in covered wagons, tents, and RVs to expand the prairie experience.

"It stood up in front of her suddenly. It was a big house, a real house with two stories, and glass windows. Its up-and-down boards were weathering from yellow to gray and every crack was battened, as Pa had said. The door had a china knob. Laura opened the door and peeped in." - **By the Shores of Silver Lake**

Laura Ingalls Wilder wrote that she had seen and lived it all - the building of railroads in wild, unsettled country, homesteading and farmers coming in to take possession of the free land. She wrote of family values, hard work and determination in the settling of the Dakota prairies and the building of the little town on the prairie, De Smet. She wrote of her childhood memories of growing up on the pioneering frontier. For over sixty years the Laura Ingalls Wilder Memorial Society has worked diligently to preserve those memories for you.

Join us for a Laura Ingalls Wilder adventure through the Surveyors' House, from 'By the Shores of Silver Lake', the First School of De Smet attended by Laura and Carrie, the Brewster School replica, and see the craftsmanship of Charles Ingalls in the last home of Ma and Pa. Do not miss viewing the wonderful exhibition of many of the original Ingalls-Wilder artifacts, such as the original church pump organ that both Ma and Mary played on.

Imagine yourself as that little girl named "half-pint" and for the first time seeing the inside of the Surveyors' House and how excited she was to be in such a big house. Make your own special memories in the little town on the prairie.

The Loftus Store



Laura wrote of Mr. Loftus and the Loftus Store in several of her "Little House" books.

Daniel Loftus came to De Smet in late 1879 and established the Loftus Store, a general merchandise store that he ran successfully until his death 43 years later. The Loftus Store became the town's social center: men would play checkers, share the latest area news and discuss crucial information such as when the train would arrive carrying much needed food for the winter.

The original Loftus Store still stands on main street (Calumet Ave) and displays memorabilia from times of yore. All are welcome to come on in and live the history.

Enjoy the Laura Ingalls Wilder Wilderness Trail & Silver Lake

The Laura Ingalls Wilder Wilderness Trail begins at 4th Street & Lyle Ave. Experience Laura's walk in the fields of the Big Slough. It gives a walk close to the shores of Silver Lake and the opportunity to experience the area as it was to early homesteaders. It also allows an easily accessible vantage point for the wide variety of birds, wildflowers, grasses, and small animals. A current project is in place to extend the trail.

Silver Lake, a pothole lake formed by the melting glaciers, is located just east of the city.

"The lake shores went lower and lower toward Big Slough, until really there was no shore. The lake melted into the slough, making small ponds surrounded by the harsh, rank slough grass that stood five and six feet tall. Little ponds glimmered between the grasses and on the water the wild birds were thick."


The Wilder Welcome Center

50 YEARS of COMMUNITY THEATER

Following a well-received production of The Long Winter performed at the De Smet High School Auditorium in 1968, community members were inspired to begin an annual outdoor theatrical production. Three years later, shaded by Pa's cottonwood trees and performed at the site of the Ingalls family's claim shanty, the Laura Ingalls Wilder Pageant debuted in June 1971. With growing interest and crowds, the pageant moved to its permanent home across the road in 1974. Every year, volunteers from De Smet and surrounding communities have dedicated their time and talent to producing a show and welcoming thousands of visitors from around the world to experience Laura's stories on the prairie landscape she loved.

Christmas Radio Play Continues to Grow

The Laura Ingalls Wilder Pageant annual radio play production harkens back to the classic format that inspired the first pageant. Unable to hold an in-person performance in 2020, the Laura Ingalls Wilder Pageant put together a fantastic show, The Hard Winter, that entertained fans from around the world in the comfort of their homes. Complete with local actors, a foley artist providing sound effects, and a live band, the production was a great success. Christmas-themed radio plays were performed in December 2021 and 2022.



De Smet Cemetery 10

Visitors to the De Smet cemetery, including the many who come to see the "Little Town on the Prairie" of the Laura Ingalls Wilder 'Little House' books, find the final resting places of the Ingalls family and several other familiar friends throughout the books and the television show. In October of 2021, the Laura Ingalls Wilder Society, with help of generous donors and Rausch Granite Monuments, Inc., cleaned and re-etched the stone marking Charles Ingalls final resting place. The stone, believed to be a family plot marker, was last recut in 1959 with the help of Rose Wilder Lane, daughter of Laura and Almanzo Wilder. The cemetery is located southwest of De Smet on a hilltop that offers several views including that of the town, original Charles Ingalls homestead and 'big slough' to the east.

Even though the original ten acres of land for the Cemetery was purchased and the Cemetery Association was incorporated in 1881 when it was still Dakota Territory, there are headstones dating back to 1880. A WPA project graveled the roadways and alleys around each block and a mausoleum was erected in 1978. Of the over 2,100 grave sites, there are veterans with service dating back to 1889; among them being men from the distinguished Company "E" serving in the Spanish American War in 1898. The St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic Cemetery lies adjacent to the east of the original cemetery.

Manchester Monument

Drive 8 miles west of De Smet on Hwy 14 to the Manchester Monument. Experience the following:

- Where renowned artist Harvey Dunn was born.
- Where Grace Ingalls Dow ('Baby Grace') lived most of her life.
- Where a 1961 Dakota Territory Centennial celebration drew nearly 150,000 people.
- How the town was destroyed by massive F-4 tornado in 2003.
- Wonderful Monument stands at site of Old Town Hall with historic Town Pump.
- Enjoy the exhilarating sunsets at the site.
- See the many varieties of native South Dakota grasses.
- Be inspired by the historic spirit of this community.
- Learn about small towns that grew along the railroad as it moved across the prairie.

'The Garden of Remembrance'

Located on the south side of the De Smet Cemetery on the road to the historical Ingalls grave sites is a quiet haven of stone, plantings, water and labyrinth. This 'Garden of Remembrance' is designed 'for the living' as a place where all who visit will find comfort and peace of mind.

- It is place where all can pray and meditate.
- Hear the comforting sounds of water falling and the babbling of the creek.
- The boulders and rocks are each different and unique in their own way just like people.

Alhat to See

- The labyrinth represents life's pathway full of twists and turns and definitely not always level ground.
- Allow yourself to let go of the presence of grief and sorrow and look to the future that we cannot see but must have hope and faith in.
- When you reach the center boulder and gaze all around you can see so much beauty of life and nature! There are trees, the plants and grasses, the flowers! You can hear the spirits thought the pine trees!
- Much love, thought and care has gone into the creation of this garden as all work was donated by community members. It is truly "A place that Heaven touches Earth."

This 'Garden of Remembrance' was built in 2008 spearheaded by the De Smet High School class of '08 after they had witnessed a great deal of tragedy with classmates and peers. There are no names placed at the Garden as it is for everyone. Many years ago the ground to the west of the Garden was the burial place of 635 plus people who passed away in poorer times and were laid to rest by the county with no recognition. It was previously called a Potter's Field. It is "For those whose names are known only to God'. Everyone is welcome to help with the care of the plants as it is all maintained through volunteer help.

- It is handicap accessible and open to everyone.
- It is a beautiful area that all should take a little time to visit, reminisce on your time in De Smet and feel the serenity.

LIVE THE LEGACY... OF THE 'WILDER' LIFE

Depot Museum / Harvey Dunn School

Take a step back in time to the early days of De Smet area residents. The current depot was built in 1906 after a fire on April 23, 1905 destroyed the original one. Pa Ingalls served at the first depot in De Smet. Contrary to the TV series, the Ingalls never actually lived in the depot. The Ingalls family lived in the Surveyors' House (which can be toured at the Laura Ingalls Wilder Memorial Society).

The Dakota Central Railway Company owned the first railroad through De Smet. Marvin Hughitt, a Chicago broker, surveyed and bought the railway and surrounding land.

He later sold the land in 1881 to the Chicago Northwestern Railroad Company. The De Smet railroad had two passenger trains for many years. One of the trains was referred to as the "400." The 400 referred to how many minutes it took to travel from Huron, SD to Chicago, II. The depot was one of the town's gathering spots.

S. Neal Meyer (local banker) purchased the depot and donated it to the city of De Smet for a museum. Mrs. Doris Thorson gave the city money to refurbish the building. Some of the original lights, windows and fixtures are still in the depot over one hundred years later. The brick walk way on the west of the depot ground was laid by the Chicago Northwestern Railroad Company in 1906.





The museum is open Tuesday through Saturday, Noon - 4 pm in the months of June, July and August. *Times may vary.*


Adjacent to the museum is the school house attended by Harvey Dunn and made famous in his painting "After School." For more information call 854-3991.



LAURA INGALLS WILDER: PRAIRIE TO PAGE

PBS AMERICAN MASTERS DOCUMENTARY

In December 2020, PBS American Masters premiered a documentary of author, Laura Ingalls Wilder. After years of research and filming, PBS provided viewers an unvarnished look at one of America's most famous children's authors. The documentary covered the Ingalls family's travels throughout the Midwest as well as the struggles and joys the family faced along their journey. Specifically, the film focused on Wilder's ideals of self-reliance and the importance of family and community.

De Smet was featured in the ninety-minute documentary as an important part of her youth. Wilder's father, Charles, moved his family to De Smet in 1879 and claimed a homestead south of town the following year. While Charles Ingalls was not a successful homesteader, he along with his wife, Caroline, spent the rest of their lives in De Smet. Much of Wilder's family also spent a majority of their lives in South Dakota and are buried in the De Smet Cemetery. As a young teacher Wilder met her husband, Almanzo, here and they were married in 1885 before moving to Mansfield, Missouri, their final home. This episode is featured in American Masters, Season 34, Episode 8. It can be viewed on pbs.org. THE CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH OF DE SMET THAT PA INGALLS HELPED BUILD

Located at 303 2nd St SW which is now the Christian and Missionary Alliance Church, the church was officially organized on June 20, 1880. One year later, money was raised to build a church building and Pa Ingalls assisted in the construction. Among the eight charter members were Charles, Caroline and Mary Ingalls. A 400-pound bell was purchased in December 1884 for \$100.38. It was the first church bell to ring in Kingsbury County. It is still used today at the De Smet Community Church on west Highway 14.



MASONIC LODGE HAS LONG TIME HISTORY WITH INGALLS & HARVEY DUNN

For over 100 years, the Masons have been active in De Smet. Located at the corner of Calumet Ave and Third Street, the former Evangelical Church was purchased by the Masons prior to World War I. Pa Ingalls was a member, being initiated in 1886. Caroline and Carrie Ingalls were charter members of the Bethlehem Chapter of the Order of the Eastern Star. The first South Dakota exhibition of renowned artist Harvey Dunn's work took place in 1950 at the Masonic Lodge in De Smet. This retrospective included examples of the artist's prairie, illustration and war works. The exhibition was originally scheduled to last a few days but stretched to 14 weeks as eager visitors came from throughout South Dakota and beyond. Moved by the public response to his exhibition, he gifted most of the works from that show to the people of South Dakota, to be maintained at South Dakota State University. This collection formed the basis of the South Dakota Art Museum permanent collection.

Laura Ingalls Wilder

Beloved children's book author, Laura Ingalls Wilder (1867 - 1957), was one of the first residents of De Smet,

SD. Laura is best known for her "Little House" series of books, the majority of which were set in the quaint town of De Smet, including By The Shores of Silver Lake, The Long Winter, Little Town of the Prairie, These Happy Golden Years, The First Four Years and On the Way Home.

In 1879, the Ingalls family moved to Dakota Territory

after Charles Ingalls accepted a railroad job and stayed the winter in the Surveyors' House. In the spring of 1880, the family established a homestead claim southeast of De Smet and watched the town rise up from the prairie. The following winter, 1880-1881, became known as one of the most severe winters on record in the Dakotas, which Laura later described in her book, The Long Winter. Once the family was settled in De Smet, Laura attended school, made many friends, and met homesteader Almanzo Wilder (1857-1949). This time in her life is well documented in her "Little House" books.

At the age of 15, Laura accepted her first teaching position, and over the next three years, divided her time between teaching at rural schools and attending school herself in De Smet. Laura stopped teaching when she married Almanzo on August 25, 1885, joining him in a new home on his tree claim north of De Smet, and agreed to help him make the claim succeed. On December 5, 1886, she gave birth to Rose Wilder and later, an unnamed son, who died soon after birth in 1889.

The people of De Smet have preserved Laura's frontier: walk the streets that Laura walked, visit the stores that the Ingalls family shopped at, tour Laura's schoolhouse, the historic Surveyors' House, and the house Pa built in town, and visit the Ingalls Homestead. Visit Laura's historic homes, enjoy prairie life with a covered wagon ride and take a stroll down De Smet's main street.

Aubrey Sherwood

Aubrey Sherwood was the unofficial historian of De Smet, constantly pushing into the limelight its worthiness as a prairie town and its "production" of people who have contributed to many facets of Americana. Editor and owner of The De Smet News, he was inducted into the South Dakota Hall of Fame in 1983.

Rose Wilder Lane

Rose Wilder was born in De Smet, SD on December 5, 1886. She was the first child of Laura Ingalls and Almanzo Wilder and

the only grandchild of Pa and Ma Ingalls.

She was a renowned American journalist, travel writer, novelist and political theorist - noted as one of the founding mothers of the American Libertarian Party.

Rose taught herself several languages and began her writing career in 1910 when she took several free-lance jobs for needed cash. After initially accepting a job as an editorial assistant for the San Francisco Bulletin, Rose launched a

free-lance writer career and wrote for many famous publications, including Harper's, Saturday Evening Post, Sunset, Good Housekeeping and Ladies' Home Journal. Lane also worked around the globe as a correspondent, and was reputed to be one of the highest-paid female writers of the early twentieth century.

It was Rose who actually encouraged her mother to launch her own writing career when Laura was in her sixties and document the memories of her frontier childhood.

Rose Wilder Lane passed away on October 30, 1968 in Danbury, Connecticut at the age of 81, the last remaining descendant of Charles and Caroline Ingalls.

Father Peter John De Smet

Among the missionaries to come to Dakota was Father Peter John De Smet, a Belgian-born Jesuit priest, for whom De Smet was



named. He first came in 1849 at which time he intended to establish missions among the Dakota Indian people. Father De Smet ministered to the dying Indians during a terrible smallpox epidemic. It is recorded that he was a devoted Christian, performing many acts of heroism. Although the priest never actually came to De Smet, the first townsmen kept alive the memory of a man who dedicated himself to exceptional service. A statue in his honor stands in Washington Park.

Wesley Hoyt Ruth

Born Nov. 6, 1913 in De Smet, Commander Ruth was awarded the Navy Cross for his actions at Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941. He piloted the first unarmed plane to take off from Ford Island/Pearl Harbor after the attack, under orders to conduct reconnaissance on the Japanese Fleet and attempt to determine whether there would be another Japanese attack. He, his copilot, radioman and three Seamen had only Springfield rifles in the cabin for use in defending themselves in case of an attack by Japanese fighter aircraft during their 250 mile NW sortie. He lived to be 101 years old.

FAMOUS DE SMET PEOPLE



Harvey Dunn

West of the De Smet Depot Museum is the country school attended by prairie artist Harvey Dunn. The school can be seen in the background of his "After School" painting.

After leaving his country school, Dunn attended South Dakota State University, the Chicago Art Institute and studied under the famous illustrator, Howard Pyle.

Dunn became one of the leading magazine illustrators for the Saturday Evening Post, was named President of the American Society of Illustrators and was an influential art teacher. He was also one of eight official illustrators selected for WWI American Expeditionary Forces. Dunn was inducted into the SD Hall of Fame in 1978.

Dunn was a frequent visitor to the prairie that he grew up on. Dunn, a realist, painted what he saw. He depicted the hard life of the homesteader and the horrors of soldiers in war. Dunn's collection consists of prairie paintings, illustrations and WWI paintings. Five of Dunn's paintings hang in the De Smet library, the Hazel L. Meyer Memorial Library, while others can be viewed at the South Dakota Art Museum in Brookings.

HISTORY...

(Excerpt from De Smet Yesterday and Today "Little Town on the Prairie" Complied and edited by Caryl Lynn Meyer Poppen)

About 10,000 years ago a large glacier covered the De Smet area. The glacier moved southward forming the west side of the Missouri River. As the glacier retreated, it left large stagnant blocks. The stagnant blocks formed the numerous South Dakota sloughs and lakes. Lake Thompson, near De Smet, is the largest glacial lake in the state.

The American Indian entered the South Dakota area during the period, between 5,000-8,000 years ago.

In 1803, President Thomas Jefferson assigned Meriwether Lewis and William Clark to explore the territory that would become the state of South Dakota in defense of the Louisiana Purchase. After exploration, Clark referred to South Dakota as the "Land of Plenty".

The present North Dakota and South Dakota area became the Dakota Territory in 1868. The history of Kingsbury County begins in 1838 when John C. Fremont of the US Army and Dr. Nicolet came through this section. The early settlers found a sea of waving grass when they arrived in the late 1800's. Kingsbury County was named for George W. Kingsbury of Yankton, a pioneer, editor, historian and legislator.

De Smet was plotted in 1880 and incorporated in 1883. Years later it was dubbed "Cream City," because of the high cream production.

The first family of De Smet was that of Charles P. Ingalls. He was the timekeeper for the railway construction crew at his camp on the shore of Silver Lake, a mile east of where De Smet was to be built. As construction work ceased in the fall of 1879, he and his wife and four daughters remained in the timekeeper's building through the winter and spring and built what was to become Ingalls' store.

By 1883, De Smet was a typical early prairie town. De Smet had about 60 buildings including grocery and provision stores, wagon shops, lumber yards, banks, a drug store, newspaper companies, a flour mill, a church, a school, an elevator, two attorneys, a harness shop, one hotel and two real estate dealers.

On November 2, 1889, President William Harrison issued a proclamation announcing the admission of South Dakota as a state of the great republic of the United States of America. The late 1890's were years of progress, which brought about the passing of the sod shanty. With the 20th century came the telephone, rural mail routes and the automobile. Progression also brought electric lights by 1910 and the radio by 1920. De Smet was among the early ones to have cement sidewalks and the surfaced streets by the 1950's.

It is full of Northern Pike, Walleye, Smallmouth Bass, Perch and Crappies. Ice fishing is a popular winter pastime here as well. Lake Thompson




Located eight miles southeast of De Smet. Lake Thompson is the secondlargest natural glacial lake in South Dakota. This 16,236-acre lake is filled with Northern Pike, Walleye, Perch and Crappies.

Bird watching is also a popular pastime at Lake Thompson. Many enthusiasts have spotted Sanderling, Ruddy Turnstone, Marbled and Hudsonian Godwits, Wilson's Phalarope, waterfowl, shorebirds in migration and Ross' Geese with huge flocks of Snow Geese.

Lake Thompson Recreation Area offers 103 campsites, four cabins and a five-bedroom group rental lodge perfect for hunters, fisherman or reunions. A playground, beach, boat dock, two comfort stations, dump station and fish cleaning station are also available.

Spirit Lake

Located seven miles northwest of De Smet, Spirit Lake is 1,259 acres and 11 feet at its deepest point. Anglers can expect to catch a variety of fish including Northern Pike, Walleye, White Crappie, Yellow Bullhead and Yellow Perch.



Dry Lake #2

Approximately 25 miles north of De Smet, Dry Lake #2 is one of the hottest lakes going for monster Master Angler yellow perch along with lots of walleyes. This lake draws fishermen from many states that stop in De Smet for supplies. It is a 6,475 acre sport fishing lake with a maximum depth of 15 feet 4 inches with many other lakes in close proximity.

Hunting Haven for Pheasant, Waterfowl and Deer

De Smet is a favorite annual retreat for hunters from across the nation and is one of South Dakota's most popular hunting destinations. We are often called "Pheasant Country". Pheasants, ducks, geese and deer are popular game that can be hunted in the area. Pheasant season opens on the third Saturday in October (**October 21, 2023**). Each spring and fall the skies are filled with thousands of snow, blue and Canada geese as they pass through on their seasonal migration. Every pond, slough and lake becomes a resting spot for the ducks and geese.



Kingsbury County Courthouse & Veteran's Memorial

As Chuck Cecil, states in his 'Stubble Mulch' column for the Brookings Register, "Of all the courthouse buildings in South Dakota, the one in De Smet, Kingsbury County, is the most unique and gets my vote as the most beautiful, too."

Kingsbury County was created February 2, 1880. The County was named after brothers George W. and T.A. Kingsbury, both prominent in territorial affairs. De Smet was chosen as Kingsbury County seat on November 2, 1880. On May 30, 1882, Mr. and Mrs. Albert Keep presented the site for the courthouse.

Built in two phases, the east wing built in 1889 and the west wing in 1898, the courthouse is somewhat unusual in that a covered drive through connects the two wings. This drive through was perfect for citizens dropping by for courthouse business during the horse & buggy days, especially if they arrived in stormy weather. It was also used to safely drop off prisoners at the county jail located in the basement and since moved to a new building.

As a building on the Federal Historical Register, renovations done in 1981 focused on maintaining historic significance. These renovations included installing new "old style" doors and duplicate wood moldings and trim throughout the building. On Veterans Day 2016, the community added a memorial on the courthouse lawn that features a bronze statue to represent each branch of the military.

Library

Mr. Loftus, a well-known merchant, was a man who valued books and his store became De Smet's first lending library. In 1926, the Mother's Club helped to establish a lending library by contacting the South Dakota State Library for help. The Mother's Club members circulated books from their homes. The home circulation method was replaced in 1928 by a library corner in Brewer's Variety Store.

During the depression, the library expanded. The library was moved into city hall, where it remained for 31 years. After the library had outgrown city hall, two prominent De Smet families donated land to build a library. The library moved to its current location at 102 1st St NE in 1968. Members of the city council renamed the library in 1981 when it became the Hazel L. Meyer Memorial Library. Once again outgrowing the space a new children's addition was added in 2003.

Mary Purintun, director, has enjoyed working at the library since 1998 and Jenny Todd, assistant librarian, has enjoyed her position since 2018. The library serves the people of De Smet and surrounding communities ranging in all ages from infants to senior citizens.

The library has continued to grow from its beginning, starting with a few books on a shelf at the Variety Store to presently over 23,000 books, as well as videos, audios, large printed books, DVD's for adults and children and magazines.

Four computers, connected to wireless internet, are available for public use. Microfilm of The De Smet News

and Iroquois Chief newspapers are available for research. With an assigned library card, you can download audiobooks and e-books at home free.

Striving to spark the love of reading in all ages, the library hosts book discussions, a First Library Card program and a Summer Reading program. Library Book Bingo is enjoyed by adults from January to April. Area Day Care providers are a part of the 'Read with Me' Book Bags program.

In the past, the library received a four-star rating in the *Library Journal* Ratings Index.

Visitors will enjoy viewing the Laura Ingalls Wilder memorabilia featured in a display case and four original **Harvey Dunn paintings** owned by the library and a fifth Dunn painting, which is owned by the local American Legion.

The Library is a proctored test site and used by many for online course testing.


